


Animal labour as a system of interspecies domination?

International Online Webinar

July 7th, 2021













Abstract:

Animal labour can be approached through different theoretical lenses, from critical theory to phenomenology, as well as pragmatic tradition and theories of communication. Each of these approaches has a particular link with description and brings with it a tradition, concepts, epistemological positions and models of reflexivity. This webinar is aimed at questioning the capacity of these different traditions to account for situations of animal labour, so as to better understand the complexities of this research topic. The concept of "domination" will be used to discuss the contributions, divergences as well as impasses and aporias of these traditions.

In addition, we wish to deepen our understanding of the descriptive issues raised by situations of animal labour by bringing to light what ethnographies owe to the commitments of the observer – to their theoretical, ethical and political choices. By questioning our descriptive choices, we hope to highlight what they entail in terms of moral, ontological and epistemological positioning, how they are put into practice, what they reveal and what they conceal, and how they are justified in the eyes of the researchers. Our aim is to compare how these choices combine critical, pragmatic and/or phenomenological perspectives, and what understandings of animal labour these combinations produce.
